Position Profile: Peace Neighborhood Center is a private, non-profit community organization that provides programs and services for individuals and families with social and financial needs. Our program coordinators are essential in helping to fulfill our mission of finding the greatness in all of those we serve. We believe that you are an individual who is flexible, hard-working, and understands how to hold ALL youth to high expectations while creating strong relationships and understanding how trauma, environment, and opportunity shape the outcomes and achievement of youth in our community.

REACH Program Manager responsibilities include:

- **Programming**: Create, implement, and evaluate social-emotional learning curriculum for after-school and summer programs for K-5th graders; assign tasks and responsibilities to staff; receive supervision from Youth Programs Director and Executive Director; participate in recruitment and registration process for youth programs.
- Interpersonal Skills: Utilize a strength-based approach in all professional interactions; promote physical and emotional safety within programs; mediate disagreements and altercations between youth; manage and de-escalate crises; support youth in developing social-emotional skills.
- **Academic Support**: Monitor academic performance; participate in creating academic plans based on feedback from school, staff, and tutors.
- **School Liaison**: work with other program staff to engage in collaborative professional relationships with school staff; conduct school visits and/or attend school meetings with parents along with the Youth Programs Director; advocate for the youth's needs individually and collectively.
- Parent & Family Engagement: Engage and communicate with parents; amplify families'
 voices and experiences in school and community settings; collaborate with Peace case
 managers to support families with household needs.
- Enrichment Activities: Assist Youth Program Director with creating incentives for youth based on attendance and engagement; plan field trips for individuals and groups; participate in family-centered activities outside of programs; attend school and community events as a Peace Neighborhood Center ambassador.






- Professional Development: Participate in staff training; attend professional development; research and promote trauma-informed practices in the office and programming; collaborate with community partners to share resources and co-host events.
- Other Agency Responsibilities: Assist with weekly fresh produce distribution; attend
 fundraising & community events, assist with annual holiday distribution; assist with meal
 preparation and building maintenance as needed; fulfill other duties to achieve the
 mission of Peace Neighborhood Center, as assigned by the Executive Director

- Have an understanding of systemic inequities and how racial segregation, racism, and discrimination affect all communities & all races.
- Understand how racial segregation, racism, and discrimination affect all communities and races.
- Be knowledgeable of the mental health needs of youth (diagnosed and undiagnosed).

- 2 3 years of experience working in after-school and/or summer programs
- Demonstrated ability to work well with individuals from diverse racial and socioeconomic backgrounds
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
