# Help Peace become our Community's next Resilience HUB!

This year, Peace is seeking to raise \$200,000+ to invest in energy efficient improvements for our 23-year old Ann Arbor facility on North Maple Road — making it possible for Peace to provide a safe place and critical support services for our families & surrounding community during disruptions, power outages, and other emergencies.

Each year, Peace's main facility serves over 16,000 meals and hosts a range of programs, community services and events for over 5,000+ youth, adults, and families.

Peace is currently working with the City of Ann Arbor's Office of Sustainability & Innovation to become a Resilience HUB for Ann Arbor's west side.

A recent energy audit of Peace's facility identified a comprehensive list of energy efficient improvements with an estimated cost of over \$460,000. All together, planned building renovations will help reduce the agency's energy consumption & carbon footprint, upgrade the building's technology systems, and set the stage for renewable energies — saving the agency at least \$30,000 in annual operating and maintenance costs.

#### WHO WE ARE

Founded in 1971, Peace Neighborhood Center is a community-supported organization with a 54+ year history of successfully helping people change their lives. Peace has helped thousands of youth, adults, and families overcome challenges that stem from generational poverty, social and economic inequality, and trauma.

Over 89% of Peace's staff identify as people of color and have similar lived experiences as the people we serve. Our staff has a deep understanding of the challenges our families face—which is essential in cultivating a genuine sense of trust, respect, and accountability with our clients.

Because of that trust, Peace is the first place our clients call with their best news and their worst.

#### WHO WE SERVE

98% of the households Peace serves live below the poverty line or ALICE threshold, unable to cover basic living expenses. Over 90%+ identify as people of color.

#### WHAT WE DO

Peace makes a long-term commitment to the youth and families we serve.

Our goal has always been to help families break generational cycles of poverty —
helping them build futures that include self-sufficiency and positive community involvement.

We provide in-depth 360° wraparound support through an integrated range of programs/services:

- After-School and Summer Programs provide K-12 youth individualized academic support, social/emotional learning, enrichment & recreational activities, and off-site learning experiences through field trips and transformational road trips beyond southeast Michigan.
- College & Career Prep for high school students, with continued support through college.
- Family Enrichment Programs promote parent engagement through family-centered activities, field trips, and skills workshops.
- Wellness Programming helps your families improve their mental, physical, social/emotional health & well-being through weekly Wellness Activities; Support Groups; and Individual & Family Counseling Support with licensed clinical social workers.
- Meals and Transportation with every program; childcare as needed.
- Case Management services connect families in need to vital community resources
- Weekly food distribution, emergency financial assistance, and holiday assistance.
- Advocacy for and with families at school, in court, and with medical care providers.

#### OUR IMPACT

Of the 5,000+ people who have attended Peace's youth & family programs, an estimated 75% have achieved self-sufficiency.

- 98% of youth enrolled in Peace's After-School Programs graduate from high school in four years.
- 80% go on to college or a skilled trade program.
- Countless Peace Alum have been the first in their families to earn a college degree.

  Many have gone on to careers to pay it forward by helping others—as educators, social workers, medical professionals, and nonprofit executives. Two Peace Alumni serve on Peace's Board.
